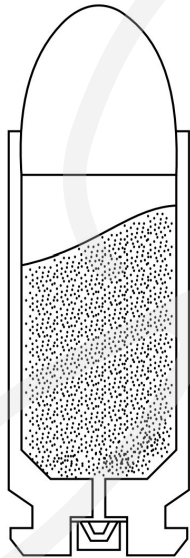

BULLET (projectile)

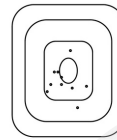
CARTRIDGE CASE (holds everything together)

GUNPOWDER (propellant)

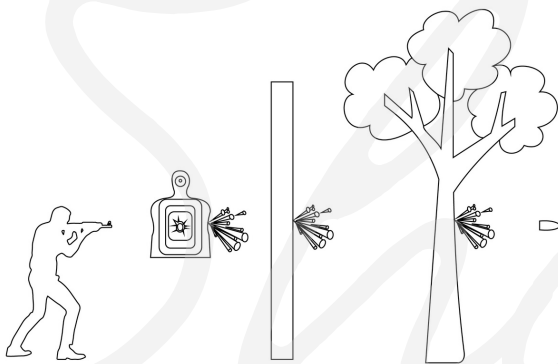
RIM (provides the extractor on the firearm a place to grip the casing to remove it from the chamber once fired)

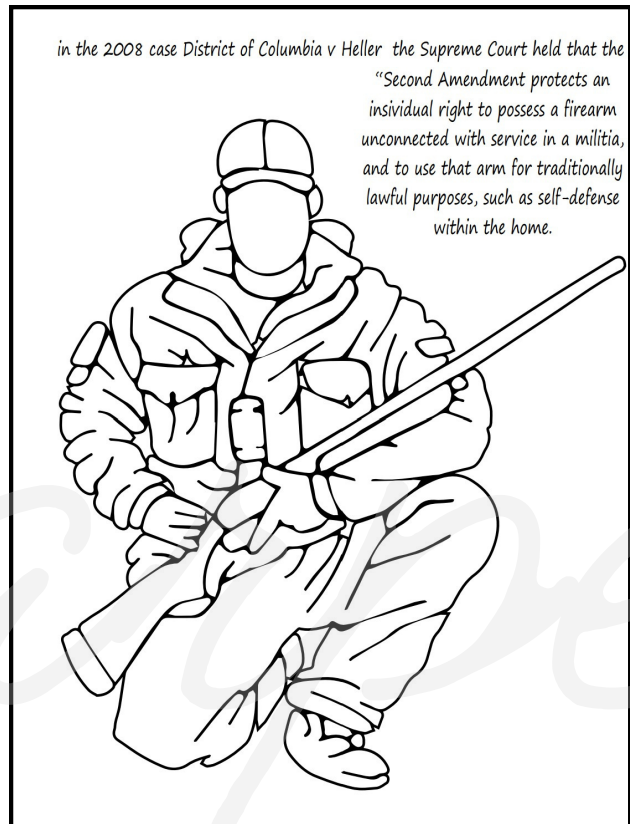
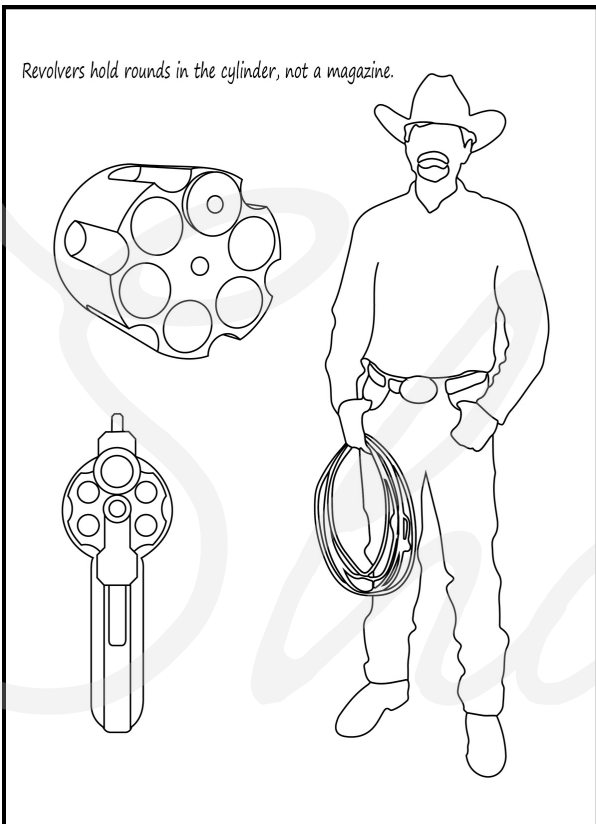
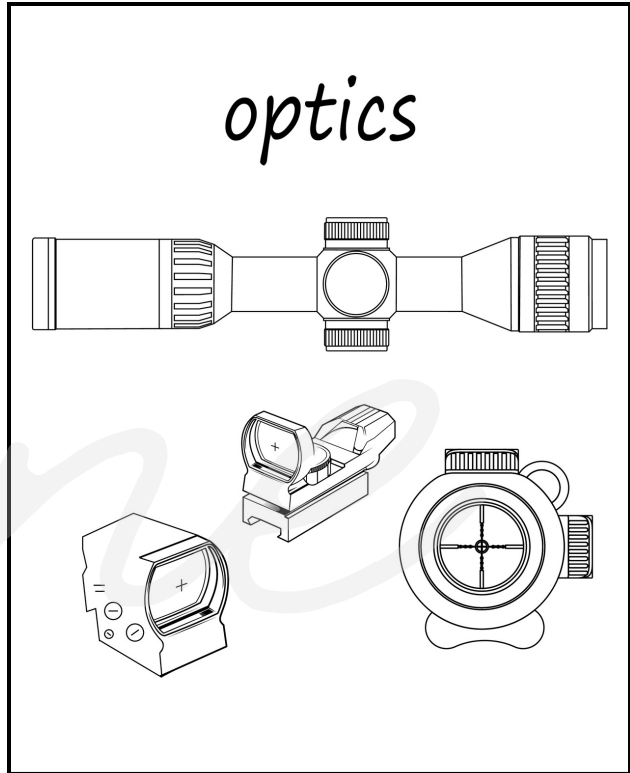
You must ALWAYS be aware of your target AND what is behind it when shooting!



A full metal jacket bullet has a soft lead core that is encased in a separate outer shell made of harder metal. Because of this shell, jacketed bullets are more likely to go right on through an object they hit. Bullets without jackets get flattened when they hit something, and don't usually go through anything else.

Ride the River by Louis L'Amour

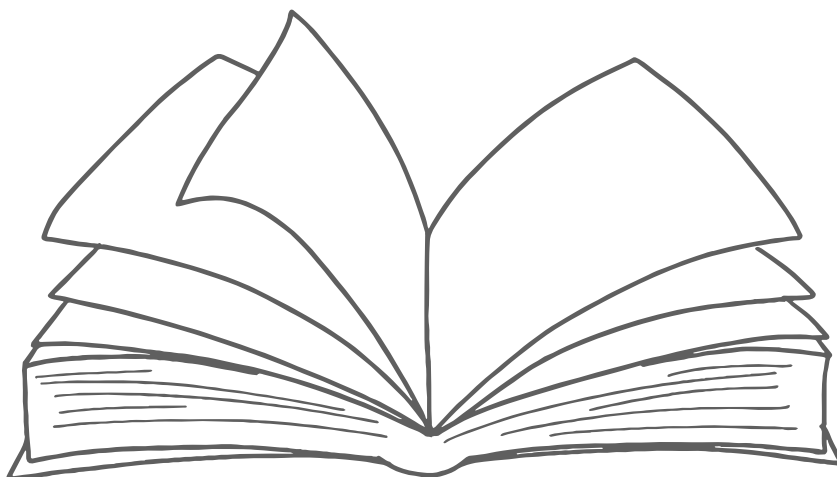

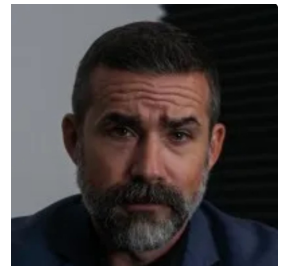
